

Frequently Asked Questions:

1. What is the IIAAA?

The IIAAA is an organization created to provide a multitude of opportunities for Indiana student athletes. To that aim, the organization will assist to improve athletic understanding and relationship throughout the high/junior/middle schools in the state of Indiana. Membership is limited to all persons involved in the directing of interscholastic athletic programs (boys and girls) in the schools in Indiana.

2. What is the NIAAA?

The NIAAA is an organization that promotes the professional growth and image of interscholastic athletic administrators. The organization promotes the development and prestige of state athletic administrators' organizations, which will contribute, in cooperation with their state high school associations, to the interscholastic athletic program of each state. The NIAAA strives to preserve the educational nature of interscholastic athletics and the place of these programs in the curricula of schools.

- a. The annual IIAAA State Conference held each March. We offer outstanding speakers/presentation, vendor exhibits and crack barrel sessions to assist you in your position as an Indiana athletic director.

- c. Helps support the district meetings held each fall and spring.
- d. Helps to foster higher standards of professional proficiency and ethics to provide the best program possible for middle/junior high school athletes.

- f. To improve the articulation of middle school interscholastic athletics in the total educational program.
- g. Assists in deferring the costs of MS/JHS awards presented each year at the State Conference.
- h. Most of all, your membership affords you the opportunity to meet and network with highly successful athletic administrators (who are also great people) all around the state of Indiana.
